Generation No. 1

1. JOHN¹ DONOHUGH He married JOHANNA HEALY February 13, 1821 in Mallow, Cork Ireland, daughter of THOMAS HEALY and ELLEN NAGLE. She was born Abt. 1802 in Killisane Townland, Annakissa Parish, Cork Ireland.

Notes for JOHANNA HEALY:

Between Daniel and John, was Johanna, the eldest daughter. Johanna married John Donohugh on February 13, 1821 in Ireland. They had at least 6 children. A number of Johanna and John's children came to Boston over the years. Checking the census we verified some of the information found in Joseph Gartland's book as well as extended some of the sketchy details he had regarding this line of the family. It is not clear if Johanna came or not, but checking the death

records we find a possible candidate. According to Joseph Gartland's book, all of Maurice Healy's siblings did come to Boston and raised their families there.

JOANNA DONAHOE was born Abt. 1792 in Ireland, and died September 28, 1865 in Boston, MA. Could this be Joanna Healy Donahoe? There was no mention of where she was buried or her maiden name. Unless I stumble across her gravesite and it provides further information it will only be pure speculation.

Of her children, Edmund, Ellen, Patrick and William all came to Boston as single individuals in their early 20's or younger. It is all likely they came with a guardian either their mother or father.

Notes for EDMUND DONOHUGH:

Edmund was the eldest, born December 9, 1821 in Mallow. His godparents were his mother's brother, John Haly (or Healy) and Catherine Pyne. He remained a bachelor but became the godfather to John Edward Donahoe in 1858. He is buried with his sister Ellen Leonard in Mt. Benedict Cemetery in West Roxbury. He died November 29, 1884 of an accident. He was living at 522 S. Third St.

Thomas appears to be followed by another son Michael who died in infancy according to Mary Healy.

Notes for ELLEN DONOHUGH:

The only daughter listed, Ellen was born November 26, 1825 also in Mallow. Her godparents were listed as DL Mcauliffe and BTT Ford. They were living in /on Carragoon at the time of her birth. Ellen married Patrick Leonard in 1855, but had no children (according to Mary Healy Gartland). Searching for records found Patrick and Ellen's marriage record a few months before her brother Patrick at the Cathedral of Holy Cross, July 1855. Patrick Leonard shows up as a godfather in 1862 to one of Patrick Donahoe's children. Ellen died of Bronchia pneumonia May 7, 1899. Her death record states she was living and buried in Boston. Her cemetery record was located at Mt. Benedict cemetery in West Roxbury. She is buried with her husband Patrick, her brother Edward, 2 nephews John and Patrick Donahoe and a grand nephew James J. Healy. Patrick died in September 1886 of Apoplexy.

2. THOMAS² DONOHUGH (*JOHN*¹) was born May 05, 1824 in Mallow, Cork Ireland/Mallow, Ireland, and died April 16, 1904 in Boston MA. He married KATHERINE MULLANE April 01, 1852 in Mallow, Cork Ireland, daughter of MICHAEL MULLANE and NORA O'CONNELL. She was born Abt. October 1830 in Ireland, and died June 14, 1904 in Boston MA.

Notes for THOMAS DONOHUGH:

Thomas, the second, was born May 5 1824. His godparents were his mother's brother, Maurice Haly (or Healy) and Ellen Reily. Thomas married Katherine Mullane in Ireland April 1, 1852 in Mallow, Cork Ireland with Bartholomew Mullane and Michael O'Connor as witnesses. They had at least 9 children. Most of their birth records were found through the Mallow Heritage Center. Checking the 1900 census we found a Thomas and Katherine Donahoe listing 7 of 8 children. Six of the children's names matched those remembered by Mary Healy and documented by Irish birth records. It listed that Thomas immigrated to Boston in 1866 and was followed 2 years later by the rest of his family. Even citing some discrepancies, I'm sure this is the correct Thomas. Among the 7 children listed are his 2 daughters Nora and Katherine who are listed as single, at this time they were married, with Katherine living next door. Most of Thomas and Catherine's children

birth records were found in Ireland.

According to his children's birth records, Thomas moved from Broomlane ST., Mallow, to Gallowshill Lane, Mallow to Bridge Street Mallow.

3. PATRICK² DONAHOE (*JOHN¹ DONOHUGH*) was born September 28, 1828 in Carragoon, Cork Ireland, and died January 01, 1892 in Boston, MA. He married MARY E PARKER November 29, 1855 in Boston, MA, daughter of WILLIAM PARKER and CATHERINE SINGLETON. She was born Abt. 1835 in Annakissa Parish, Cork Ireland, and died May 29, 1905 in Boston, MA.

Notes for PATRICK DONAHOE:

Patrick Donahoe arrived prior to 1855 in Boston. It was initially speculated the patriarch, Patrick Donahoe arrived with his wife, Mary E. Parker Donahoe. However, this has since proven false. Thanks to my cousin, Jack Donahoe I found a new tidbit of information on the Donahoe and Parker families. Jack was told that Patrick Donahoe and Mary Parker came over to America on the same ship. They then met up later, courted and were married. I always believed that Mary and Patrick met and married in Ireland. Both grew up in the same town. I verified this by Irish records. Going on Jack's tidbit, and yes, Lo and behold, I found Patrick and Mary's marriage record. Fr. James A Henly of Boston married them November 29, 1855 in Boston at the Cathedral of Holy Cross-. Mary was 20 years old and Patrick was 21. John Sweeney and Mary A Ryan were their sponsors.

Supporting documents show, many of Patrick's family had settled in Boston, some since the late

1820's. Shortly after they married, Patrick and Mary lived with Patrick's uncle, Maurice Healy, until at least 1862. After settling in Boston, the Donahoe's had 11 children (according to 1900 census of Mary Donahoe. Records identified only 10 children today).

Patrick took care of his large family by making chairs. Patrick Donahoe died New Years day 1892 of pneumonia. After Patrick died, his wife Mary moved in with her sister Ellen Parker. She lived there until she died 13 years later of kidney failure.

The Donahoe's arrived prior to formal records being kept by Ireland, which made it difficult to determine their county of origin. Mary and Patrick listed only Ireland as place of birth, and did not list the county within Ireland. Oral history states they came from County Cork. Further research determined that they came from Killisane Town land near Castletownroche, in the parish of Annakissa, County Cork. Patrick was born September 28, 1828. His godparents were his mother's eldest brother, Daniel Healy and Kitty Carroll. On Patrick Donahoe's naturalization application. It states that he entered via New York in August 1852. He was born July 1836. At the bottom you can see a copy of his signature. According to S.S. Star of the West Liverpool to New York December 4, 1852, There is a Patrick Donohoe listed on the manifest. Passenger 277 Pat Donohoe, age 19, M Servant, Ireland.

The 1860 Massachusetts census listed Patrick Donohoe age 28, laborer with \$50 personal estate born in Ireland. His wife Mary, age 26 was also born in Ireland. They had 3 children, Ann M age 3, Catherine F age 2 and John E age 1 all born in Massachusetts. Later census records indicated that both Ann and Catherine F were born in Ireland. Baptismal records were found for both of them in Massachusetts, which leads us to conclude that these later records, were false.

In 1862, Patrick Donahoe applied for and received a license to carry on the business or occupation of a Retail Liquor Dealer at 34 Seneca Street in Boston. A copy of this license (no. 5869) was found in his youngest son's belongings. He paid \$20.00 for this license and it was good for 1 year ending on September 1, 1863.

Another treasure found amongst his youngest son's belongings was Patrick's naturalization record. It was registered in the Circuit Court of the U.S at Boston on October 16, 1871 and was recorded on January 1, 1872. It lists his occupation as chair seater born in County Cork Ireland. Searching for the application in National Archives indicates that Patrick was born on or about July 1836. This is puzzling, as I believe I have found his birth record on September 1 1828 in Cork. It also states that he arrived in New York on August 1852. It also identifies that he has lived in both New York and Massachusetts. This generates more questions, was he in fact 16 years of age and unmarried when he arrived? His Uncle Maurice Healy and James Kane witness it.

Patrick Donahoe's grave is situated next to the German section in Holyhood Cemetery. Patrick owned 3 adjacent plots. I actually stumbled upon this gravesite, while looking for another

ancestor who was supposed to be buried nearby. The first plot (Walk B, Grave No. 18) contains Patrick and his wife Mary, as well as 3 of their children (Catherine F., a stillborn child and Annie M). The second plot (Grave N. 20) only contained 2 bodies, one of Patrick and Mary's daughter, Mamie Donahoe and a granddaughter, Evelyn. The third plot (Grave No.22), contained a child named Timothy Donahoe (parents were John and Catherine Donahoe), Ellen Parker (Mary Donahoe's younger sister). There were also 2 other individuals, which I have not been able to connect to the Donahoe family Catherine Cook and Robert Coort. Patrick's wife, Mary was originally buried in this plot, but was later removed to be with her husband to make place for her sister Ellen.

An interesting piece of trivia: At least 2 of Patrick's children, William and Daniel, have had a large incidence of Diabetes in their family. The Joselin Clinic of Boston is currently using the Donahoe clan to determine hereditary links in this disease.

Bernie Donahoe has a number of his ancestor=s treasures. Including is his grandfather=s rifle he used during the Spanish American War, as well as his great-grandfather=s family bible. It measures about 10 inches by 14 inches and In 1998 was in beautiful shape and has his name engraved in the leather surface. There is no date stated inside the Bible, but it does reference John Hughes the Archbishop of New York and John B FitzPatrick, Bishop of Boston. Inserted within the pages is a card listing Certificate of St. Joseph's Union until March 1 1864. Patrick most likely owned this.

In the center of the book are some handwritten notations under Marriages, Births and Deaths.

Notes for MARY E PARKER:

Mary Parker, was Patrick Donahoe's wife, and the author's great-great grandmother? Little is known about the Parker family at this time. A copy of Mary's parents wedding certificate was found in Mallow, Cork. William Parker (a Roman Catholic) married Catherine Singleton on January 21, 1821. Timothy Singleton and Michael Parker are listed as witnesses. It does not state the parent's names of either the bride or the groom.

Anna, Patrick and Mary's eldest daughter never married. She was born in the summer of 1856 in Boston, according to her baptismal certificate. Although she went by Anna, her baptismal certificate is listed under Joanna Donohue. She was probably named for Patrick's mother, Johanna Healy Donohugh. On July 3, 1856, at St. James the Greater Church in Boston, Joanna was baptized. Her sponsors were Maurice Huley and Catherine Parker. Maurice Huley was in fact, Patrick's Uncle Maurice Healy. Catherine Parker was Mary's eldest sister. It raises an interesting question; does this imply that Catherine was resident in Boston at the time of this christening? I was not able to find any other trace of her in Boston. Anna died at the age of 31 on November 12, 1887.

Catherine, their second daughter, was born about October 24, 1857 in Boston, Massachusetts but she died as a young child in Boston on September 9, 1860. Catherine Frances was

Ellen came after John according to the 1880 census. Her baptismal record was found at St. James the Greater. It listed her date of birth as November 22, 1860. Her godparents were Patrick Leonard and Margaret Dugan. Ellen remained single and died May 1910. Her death certificate listed her age as 46. She was often referred to as Nellie. Nellie is buried in Holyhood cemetery, in a plot owned by Dennis Singleton (Walk B, Grave 20).

Mary Elizabeth was born 2 days after Christmas in 1862. Mary or Mamie was baptized at St. James the Greater. Her godparents were Michael Crowley and Mary C. Gartland. Mary Gartland was Patrick's first cousin, and daughter of Maurice Healy. According to Margaret Donahoe Cotter, Michael Crowley was also a cousin, but I have yet to determine how. Mamie also remained single and lived to the ripe old age of 90, primarily as a resident of 130 Dakota St in Dorchester. Mamie often kept in touch with her relatives back in Ireland and Canada. Her niece Margaret Donahoe remembers delivering a message to a cousin Detective Joseph Dever from Police Station 7 from some correspondence Mamie had received from relatives in Ireland. The Dever family married into the Donahoe family when married Quintin Dever married Patrick Donahoe's niece.

Memories from Anne Tullis : Aunt Mame used to walk to St Ambrose Mass every morning until she was very old. She always gave us religious medals and such for promotions etc...

After Daniel, Mary and Patrick had a child who died at birth in 1871. Their youngest daughter followed him, another they named Catherine on March 1 1872. She was baptized at Cathedral of the Holy Cross, with Dennis Singleton and Rose Ann Campbell as her godparents. She remained single and died at the age of 52, August 1924. Catherine went by the nickname Kate.

There is a story that at one time; Kate and Nellie set off to visit their relatives in Canada. Unfortunately, for some reason they didn't make it and had to turn back home. Kate is buried in Holyhood cemetery with her sister Nellie. Kate had a will drawn up which was found by her grand nephew, Bernard Donahoe. It is listed under the name Katherine F. Donahoe of 11 Loring Street. On the petition are the following names,

§ Joseph PA Donahoe of Boston (brother living at 19 Loring St),

§ Mary E Donahoe of Boston (sister living at 93 Bowdoin St),

§ William A Donahoe of Boston (brother living at 26 Everett St),

§ Daniel T Donahoe of Boston (brother living at 130 Dakota St)

§ Mary C Donahoe of Boston (niece - son of her brother John Edward).

4. WILLIAM² DONAHOE (*JOHN¹ DONOHUGH*) was born January 26, 1836 in Killavullen, Cork Ireland, and died August 15, 1876 in disappeared while looking for work outside Boston. He married HANNAH CONNELL July 10, 1866 in Boston, MA, daughter of THOMAS CONNELL and HANORA ???. She was born Bet. 1840 - 1847 in Ireland, and died March 26, 1913 in Boston MA. William was born January 26, 1836. By this time his parents had moved from Mallow to

Killavullen Parish and living on B Sheehn Street. His godparents were Michael Connell and Bridget Doolin. According to the account of records listed in his pension, he had arrived in Boston prior to 1857 as a young man - unmarried.

William married Hannah Connell July 1866 in Boston and had 3 children (John (1870), Joanna (1871) and Patrick (1873)). His first cousin, Mary Healy Gartland told her grandson that William was lost in the Civil War. I do not believe this is true as his children were born after the Civil War. (The war ended June 1865). Checking his wife's applications for pension records in the 1890's, it is clear that William disappeared from Boston in August 15 1876, when he left to look for work outside of Boston. His wife eventually applied for a pension against his Civil War service where it details this information.

I did check the Civil Pension record and found 2 matches, referring to the same person. It lists a William Donahoe who entered the service under an alias William Murphy. His wife is listed as Hannah Donahoe. According to military records he was 23 years old, and a private in Company E, 59th Regiment Massachusetts Infantry in 1864 slated for the service for 3 years. This would make him 5 years younger than expected. On May 26 1865 he was transferred to Washington D.C. He was discharged on July 30 1865.. (August 15 1891 - Application number 524 677, Certificate number 450 439). Affidavits from his son, Patrick, wife, Hannah, sister Ellen Leonard and first cousin Mary Gartland were listed amongst the records for application of pension.

I obtained copies of the Muster rolls for William Murphy. Below is a summary of the records:

Ellen was Jerimiah and Margaret's first child born in Boston. She was born April 1, 1874 and characterized as a strong woman. She married Daniel Donahoe in Jan 1893 and bore 10 children for Daniel, including two sets of twins. Ellen, in life, showed concern for all, despite race or religion. She was often asking her children to help others who were having any difficulties. Years after Jerimiah immigrated, the church in Ireland notified Ellen Manning Donahoe, that the remaining family lands were left to them. Ellen had the land donated to the church. Could this be the clue which, will help me identify where the Manning family originated from? Ellen died in 1936 a little over a year after the death of her brother John. According to her daughter, Margaret, at Ellen's funeral people lined the streets because they so loved her to pay tribute to her life.

Memories of Ellen from Anne Tullis - "My grandmother Ellen used to make her own bread; bought produce from the horse drawn peddler that came around the streets. She used to send her boys down the street on Saturday evenings to light the candles for the Rabbi in the synagogue. She was loved by everyone. Andrew Dirksmeier used to say she was his BEST Critic (for his paintings) because she was SO honest. - She was not afraid of any type of work and even was said to put in her own cement driveway to a garage in the rear of her home. Grampa Donahue was a quite man.

Daniel Donahoe and Ellen Manning's eldest daughter was Gertrude. I have very fond memories of my grandmother. She was very religious woman and she made the best soft-boiled eggs I have ever had. She was a tiny woman and had the softest skin in the world. She was also very much full of life and spoke her mind. As I mentioned earlier, Gertrude worked for John T. Connor's as a cashier and then clerk. Here she probably met her future husband Andrew Dirksmeyer. Gertrude and Andrew were married in 1921 and had 7 children, Andrew (married Irene Fein), Gertrude, Anne (married Bob Tullis), Paul (married Louise Marini), Virginia, Joseph (married Louise Sironem), and Ros

Notes for ANDREW LOUIS DIRKSMEYER:

Andrew Dirksmeier, 88, a pioneer member of St. Mary's HOLY Name Society for 74 years and founder/director of Belles and Beaux, a volunteer organization which for 35 years entertained military bases, veterans hospitals, senior citizens facilities and nursing homes.

He was a retired insurance agent for the Prudential Insurance Company where he worked for 33 years.

A World War I Army veteran, he was a life member of the Cyril P Morrisette American Legion Post.

His favorite past-time is oil-painting. His home at 72 Shirley Street is graced with murals as well as many paintings. Primary theme are religious, or early American Indian.

Andrew Dirksmeier was inducted into the Army Oct 5, 1917 and served until May 2, 1919.

The youngest child of Henry and Sophie, Andrew Louis(1894) married Gertrude Donahoe. Andrew and Gertrude had seven children. Herbert and Andrew both served in the military about the same time. While searching for pictures, I came across a couple of pictures of Herbert in drag. Checking the notes on the back of the pictures, it was apparent that Herbert was a bit of a ham, and would ham it up at local church charity events for entertainment. Henry Dirksmeier and Sophie Muller's youngest son, Andrew, was the author's grandfather. As a young adult, Andrew was a manager of the John T. Conner Company stores. A young woman, named Gertrude Josephine Donahoe worked there as a clerk. Although, it is not clear that this was where they first met, Andrew and Gertrude started dating. Shortly afterwards, Andrew entered World War I. Andrew was inducted into the Army on October 5, 1917 and began active service as a Private. During his stint in the Army, my mother recalls hearing about how her father improved the mustering out of pay. She writes: "I remember my father telling us that when he was in charge of payroll in the army he had always seen long lines of soldiers waiting to be mustered out (discharged) and couldn't see the need for it.

So he developed these Lay-overs (enclosed) to put over the maps (instead of doing each man separate as they head the line). He'd place lay-overs over map to see distance the man had to travel to get home, and the lines moved much faster. P.S. That's the artist coming out again." My mother gave me a book which my grandfather used Hammond's Handy Atlas of the World dated 1916. It included 2 lay-overs of the map of the United States drawn by my grandfather. The first one was from March-Nov and had 4 regions, the second one was from December - February and had 4 different regions depicted for the same map. He was honorably discharged on May 2, 1919 at Camp Devens with the rank of SPC; QMC Det. Word was sent back home that he had died of pneumonia. Gertrude believing he was dead, was extremely shocked when he showed up at her door. They continued dating and were married in 1921. They honeymooned in Franconia Notch, New Hampshire.

Andrew was a very talented artist. He decorated his entire home with oil paintings he had made over the years, primarily either religious or of the American Indian's theme. He painted a mural, which covered his entire bathroom walls. Andrew and Gertrude, settled initially in Dorchester at 130 Dakota St. In 1940 Andrew's sister, Etta, told her brother about the house on Shirley Street in Quincy. Andrew and Gertrude checked out the home and decided to buy it and move their family from Dorchester. They lived there for the remainder of their lives becoming very active members of St. Mary's Church in West Quincy, MA. Andrew and Gertrude raised seven children, Andrew Jr. (1922), Trudy (1925) Anne (1927), Virginia (1929) Paul (1930) Joseph (1934) and RoseMarie (1937). Andrew, his wife Gertrude and daughter RoseMarie, are buried in St. Mary's Cemetery in West Quincy.

Andrew and Gertie Dirksmeier celebrated more than 50 years of marriage together. Their children helped commemorate their golden anniversary, planned a surprise party at the Naval Sub Base in Weymouth Massachusetts. The celebration included a renewal of their vows at St. Mary's Church with all of their family and many of their friends in attendance. Andrew Sr. started a musical group called the Belles and Beaux in 1948. This group was made up of family and friends who toured military bases, churches, and nursing homes putting on shows for entertainment. Andrew encouraged all of his children to participate in the troop. It has often seen guest appearances by many of his grandchildren and great-grand children, as his children continued to run the musical group long after his death. The Dirksmeier children were very active in the musical group that their father started.

Mary or Mamie also worked at John T. Connor's as a cashier and clerk. Mamie had a son out of wedlock, which was raised by her Uncle John Manning. Speculation is that Leo was the natural son of her future husband Thomas Singleton, but I found no supporting proof of this. Mamie was the first of her siblings to marry. She married Thomas Singleton in 1918. Thomas, according to oral history, was a third cousin. Mamie and Thomas had 6 children, Mary, Tommy Jr., Helen, William, John, Fran. Tom died in 1932 (from residual affects of the war according to his youngest daughter), leaving Mamie to raise her brood by herself. Mamie supported her family on her husband's military stipend. Mamie was a member of the American Legion and participated in many of their events. Tom Singleton, Junior was also a decorated serviceman.

Tom Singleton Jr was one of the boys which Etta Dirksmeier kept in contact during the war. In her scrapbook she has many notations regarding Tom's service. Amongst them include

§ Citation for Bronze Star Medal - Thomas J Singleton 11020795, Private, Company C 1st Medical Battalion. For heroic achievement in connection with Military operations against the enemy in the vicinity of Aachen, Germany, 14 October 1944. Attacked by enemy air craft while transporting casualties to an aid station, Pvt Singleton, coolly assisted the injured to a place of safety and, although wounded by shell fragments remained in exposed terrain until all fellow victims had been evacuated. Pvt. Singleton's courage and self sacrificing devotion to duty reflect great credit upon the Army Medical Dept.

§ Citation for Oak Leaf Cluster and Bronze Medal - Thomas J Singleton 11020795, Pvt. The skill, zeal and courage with which Pvt Singleton, performed his duties as personal and supply driver, despite difficult combat conditions, contributed materially to the efficiency of his organization throughout the North African and Sicilian campaigns.
